

AGEING WELL, AGEING INDEPENDENTLY

As Cumbria's ageing population continues to grow we shall seek to ensure that individuals retain their dignity; to provide choice and promote independence we will

- Make sure that looking after our older and most vulnerable residents right across Cumbria remains one of our top priorities.
- Listen and respond to our ageing populations' needs, and ensure that our decisions take into consideration the wishes and concerns of residents in Cumbria.
- Support adults to remain in their own property as long as is possible, using modern technology and reablement aids to make sure residents stay safe and socially connected.
- Modernise the way we look after older people in Cumbria, exploring options to increase the provision of extra care housing, working in close partnership with developers and agencies to achieve locally led solutions.
- Build strong partnerships with the NHS and other local partners to improve the health and quality of life for all Cumbrian residents, and assist with reducing the need to access acute services.
- Work alongside local charities and organisations to promote Dementia Awareness across all sectors and communities.



CARING FOR CUMBRIA'S CHILDREN & FAMILIES

Supporting our future generation to create equal opportunities for all regardless of background, circumstances, or abilities we will

- Ensure that children in Cumbria are protected from harm and that effective systems are in place to help anyone to report their concerns about a child in potential danger.
- Commit to improving the educational outcomes for Looked After Children and support their transition to adulthood.
- Help all of our children have the best possible start in life by working with a range of partners and focusing upon Early Help interventions; stop families and children from falling into need and provide additional support for them when it is needed.
- Strive to improve outcomes and standards in all schools ensuing that all children in Cumbria achieve their full potential.
- Review "post 16 years" travel costs and explore options to enable all young people, regardless of where they live to access the education they deserve.
- Ensure that health checks for Looked After Children and children with mental health needs are carried out in a timely manner in schools.
- Invest in apprenticeships through strengthening our relationships with businesses and organisations.



SUPPORTING AND STRENGTHENING LOCAL COMMUNITIES

We recognise the importance of our local communities, and we want to listen in order to truly understand the local needs and to support their resilience. Encouraging self help where appropriate we will

- Improve the resilience of the county to flooding, and be proactive regarding our duties as the Lead Local Flood Authority. Support work with local communities to promote awareness using local knowledge and resources.
- Ensure that Cumbria Fire and Rescue Service remains at the cutting edge protecting our residents from harm; encourage greater collaboration with police and health colleagues through the delivery of prevention activities to those in need.
- Work with the local police and the Police and Crime Commissioner to support their policing priorities to improve community safety.
- Provide a modern library service throughout the county using innovative and local solutions. Each community is different and our services will reflect their local needs.
- Improve community transport options and identify local solutions, to enable communities to feel connected and access services. Investigate opportunities to provide a local transport fund.
- Support local community groups to take over surplus Council assets with a view to creating more sustainable community facilities.



PROVIDING A SAFE & WELL MANAGED HIGHWAYS NETWORK

To maintain a fit for purpose Highways network, which prioritises and works within existing budget constraints whilst focusing upon local priorities we will

- Develop a programme of priorities for local major highways schemes whilst addressing ongoing concerns including potholes and drainage issues in a timely manner.
- Work closely with Government and the Local Enterprise Partnership, to deliver significant investment to improve our highways and transport links. We will lobby for improvements to be made to key strategic infrastructure routes e.g. A590, A595 in order to support economic growth and local accessibility.
- Promote a system of 24 hour working on the highways where possible, to achieve better value from our resources and a speedier maintenance of roads.
- Ensure that investment for flood prevention measures is used in the areas of most need to minimise flood damage and protect homes and businesses.
- Work with utility companies and contractors to put in place a more flexible approach to roadworks, that will minimise disruption to motorists and help maintain standards and the integrity of the highway.
- Review the existing framework contract for highways programmes, and work with local contractors to ensure they are in the strongest possible position to compete for framework contracts.
- Ensure that our highways network is equipped to tackle extreme winter weather through working with partners and local communities.
- Ensure that all funding provided by central government to support transport options is utilised fully to enable our communities to travel freely.



BEING A VALUE FOR MONEY COUNCIL

To effectively manage services within the challenging, financial climate; reviewing services and ensuring that we always get best value for tax payers money we will......

- Work with the other local authorities in Cumbria and beyond, exploring
 opportunities to develop stronger working relationships, striving to
 streamline services and reduce costs. Whilst we recognise that the
 introduction of a Unitary Authority could support this we need to ensure
 that our District and Borough partners share our vision, and that we are
 able to lobby effectively with one voice.
- Increase partnership working with other organisations both in the public and private sector, to reduce duplication and increase the efficiency and effectiveness of service delivery across Cumbria.
- Make sure that the extent and cost of Trade Union facility time is proportionate and transparent.
- Effectively manage the Council's budget to enable us to minimise our finance charges, and maximise the amount we can spend on our frontline services, especially for the children and adults in our care.



IMPROVING AND PROMOTING HEALTH & WELLBEING

To promote healthier lifestyles and ensure the wellbeing of all residents right across Cumbria we will


- Improve the health and wellbeing of residents by promoting and encouraging healthy lifestyles through our Public Health responsibilities.
- Support communities to take ownership of their own health and wellbeing by providing information and signposting to local services.
- Build strong working relationships with health and social care partners to provide a more joined up service for the benefit of everyone in Cumbria. We will expand upon existing partnerships whilst seeking to work with new organisations.
- Strengthen partnership working with health commissioners and other professionals to improve health inequalities in the areas of most need.
- Push for better mental health services, especially for young people.
- Ensure that we provide support for our most vulnerable residents to improve their quality of life.



STIMULATING ECONOMIC GROWTH

To secure investment into the County and promote Cumbria as open for business, ensuring that everyone has good prospects and a bright future we will

- Support the continued rollout of Superfast Broadband across the County, and lobby for improved broadband connectivity and speeds for all especially in rural areas.
- Push for improved mobile phone coverage across the County.
- Work with the business community, the Local Enterprise Partnership and central government to bring further inward investment and prosperity to the County.
- Support central government's national priority to create new Apprenticeships, aiming to grow the potential of our young people providing local jobs for local people.
- Recognise the importance of the Nuclear Industry on the West Coast in support of job creation and key strategic infrastructure including road, rail and sea; seeking to promote future developments as and when they arise.
- Work in partnership with property developers to identify mutual benefits from major developments for both communities and businesses alike.
